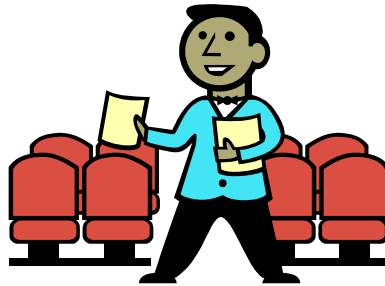

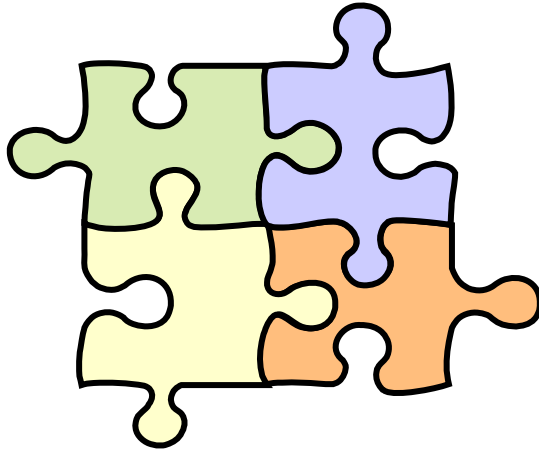
Film Club

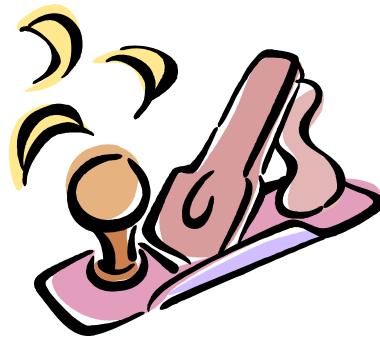
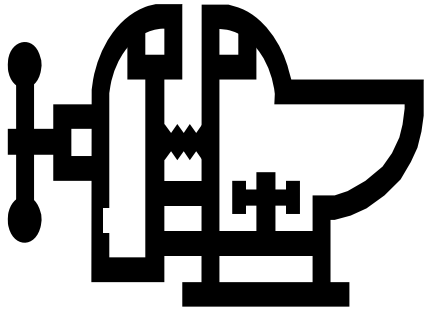
Percussion Ensemble

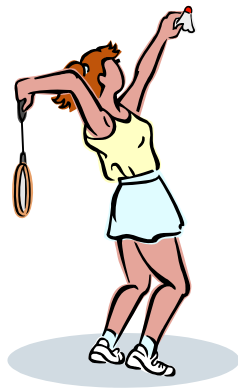

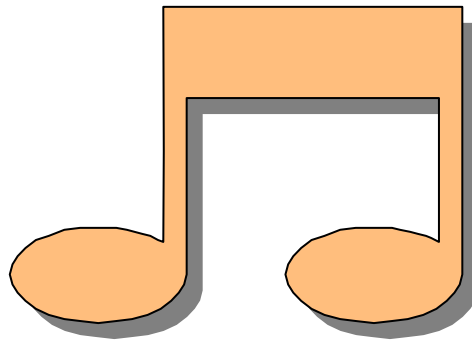

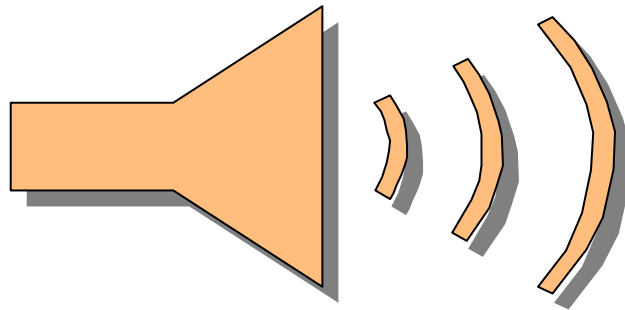
String Ensemble (Violins, Violas, Cellos & Double Basses)

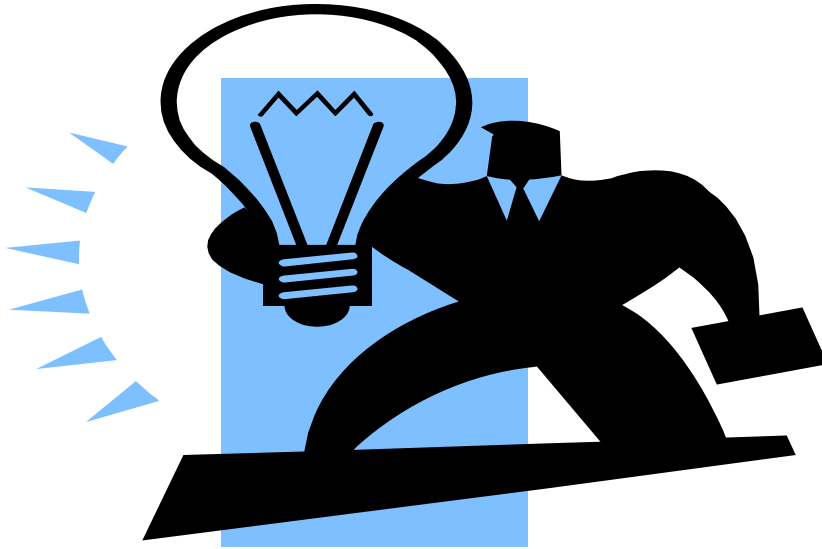

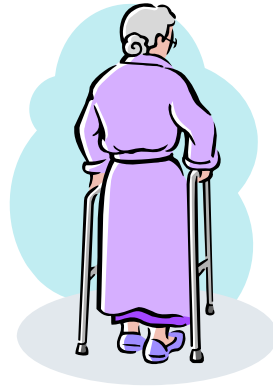
